**Strike 2:** As thousands of victims of Hurricane Katrina suffered, President Bush and his hand-picked emergency management team were **slow to act** – but quick to **suspend rules** that would have opened doors for more women and minorities to participate in the Gulf Coast rebuilding process and guarantee them a fair wage.

**Strike 3:** After paying respects to the late Civil Rights leader Rosa Parks in the Capitol Rotunda, President Bush returned to the White House to nominate to the Supreme Court Judge Samuel Alito – who has used his power as a federal judge to try to **weaken** access to the courts for victims of discrimination, **undermine** congressional authority to protect the common good, and give legal cover to abusive police actions.
